# 3. BCSTA AGM Motion Submission

The chair suggests that a motion be submitted to BCSTA to pursue with the Minister of Education the idea of an amendment to the BC School Act that includes steps for a clear process for censure of trustees.

# Whereas:

An increasing number of boards in BC have censured trustees for various infractions of their own Code of Ethics, or in our case, Worksafe BC laws;

# It is recommended:

THAT the Board of Education for School District No. 78 (Fraser-Cascade) have BCSTA President Teresa Rezansoff pursue with Minister Bernier the idea of an amendment to the Public BC School Act that echoes the law currently in effect in Nova Scotia:

- Under the legislation, school board members will be required to take on an oath of office agreeing to adhere to the prescribed Code of Ethics. Individual boards may add their own items to their code of ethics as long as they include the standard items;
- Boards will also be required to adopt standardized procedures for the conduct of meetings. Board members must inform the chairperson in advance if they wish to leave a meeting, to ensure the board has the proper quorum. The new regulations also prohibit board members from disclosing confidential information;
- Boards will have the authority to censure individual members for violating the board's code of ethics. It includes the power to suspend a member for one to three months, or to recommend to the Minister to vacate a member's seat. A censured board member will have the right to appeal;
- The Minister will retain authority currently under the act to replace an entire board, but with the ability to appoint one or more individuals to act as the board;
- The legislation also defines how school board vacancies will be filled; and
- Vacancies less than six months before a school board election will remain vacant. For vacancies six months to two years before an election, the Minister of Education will appoint a person in consultation with boards. Special elections will be called to fill vacancies more than two years before a school board election.
