4. <u>Presentation: Canadian Leadership Conference</u>

Teachers Lenora Poulin and Erin Wilkins from Hope Secondary introduced 5 students that participated in the BC Student Leadership Conference (BCSLC) and the Canadian Leadership Conference (CSLC).

The CSLC was held in Edmundston, New Brunswick Sept. 27 – Oct. 1, 2016. This small French speaking community welcomed 800 delegates (8 from HSS). Some speakers spoke completely in French, in which headsets were made available. Waterloo, Ontario is hosting in 2017.

The BCSLC was held at Rockridge Canyon Conference Centre in Princeton, Oct. 20 – 23, 2016. This conference was sold out (385 delegates – 13 from HSS). Surrey is hosting in 2017.

Students shared their key take-aways from both conferences. Fundraising has already begun for next year.

5. <u>Ministry of Education Updates</u>

The Superintendent shared the Ministry's highlights from 2015/16:

- SD78 will use Ministry's revised reporting policy
- Grad requirements will remain the same for 2016/17
- Grad requirements for 2017/18 will be 80 credits of course work (52 required, 28 elective)
