Gerry reviewed the 2023/2024 Amended Annual Budget that will be presented to the Board of Education. Highlights from this portion of the meeting:

Key Budget Dates:

- Sept 30 Student Count Enrolment snapshot 1701
- October to January Budgets are reviewed and amended to reflect the September 30th student count, current staffing, and any events that impact the budget
- Dec 15 amended funding provided
- January to February Amended Budget discussed with Budget Advisory Committee, and the Board of Education for 3 readings
- Feb 28 Amended Budget and Bylaw due to the Ministry of Education
- Mid March funding announcement MOE
- March to April Budget Assumptions to Budget Advisory Committee, the Board and staff for review and input on significant budget contractions and/or expansions.
- May to June To Board of Education for 3 readings
- June 30th Approved Preliminary Budget due to Ministry of Education

Gerry spoke about the enrolment trends in our District, presented the operating fund breakdown and gave a breakdown about the different types of funds used in the school district:

- Operating Funds Instruction, School and District Administration

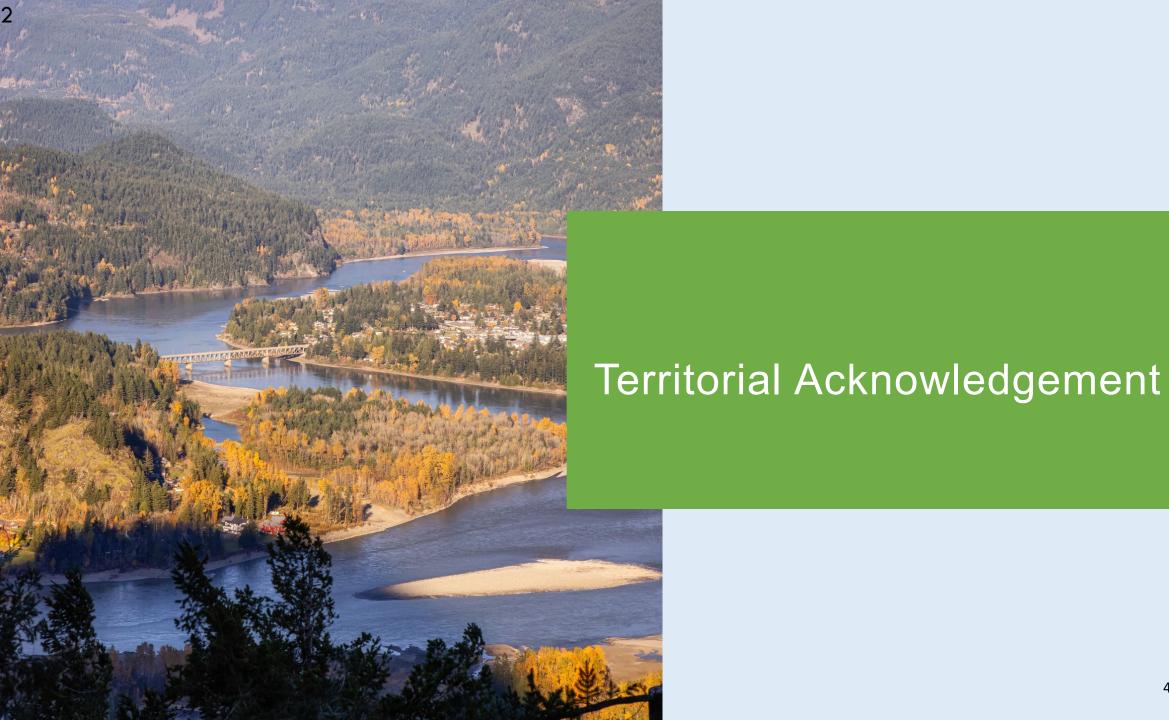

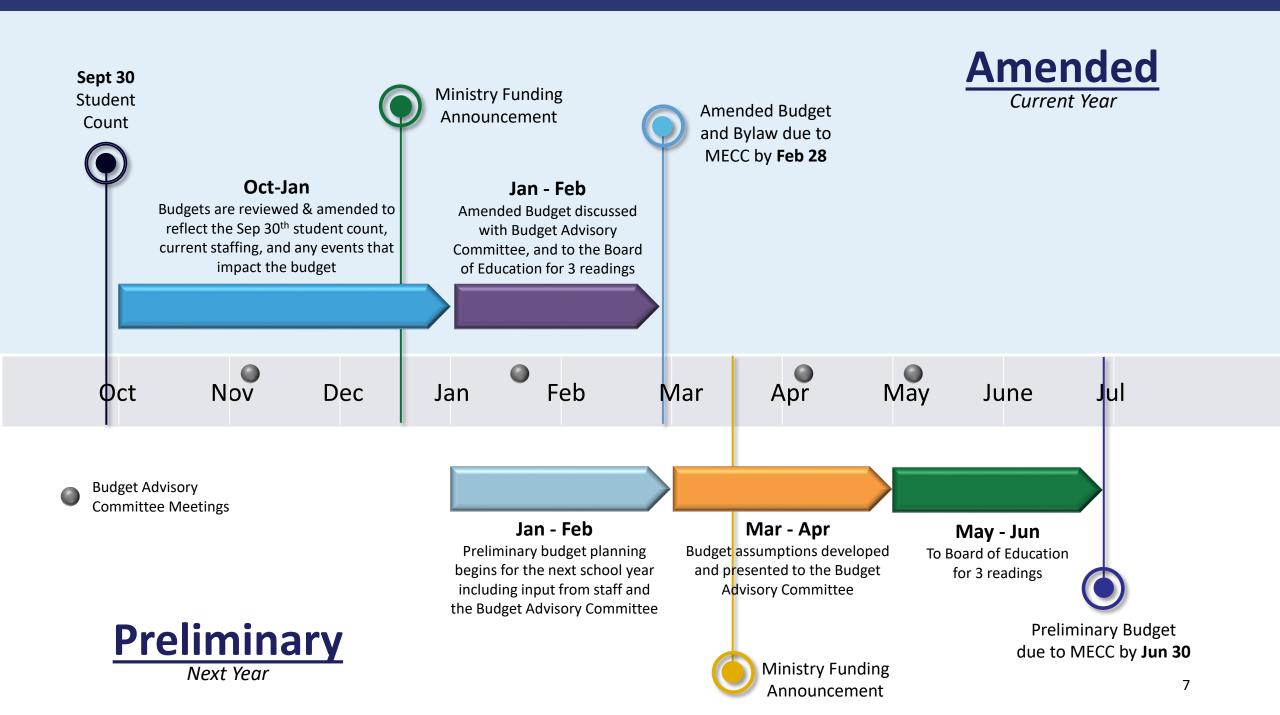

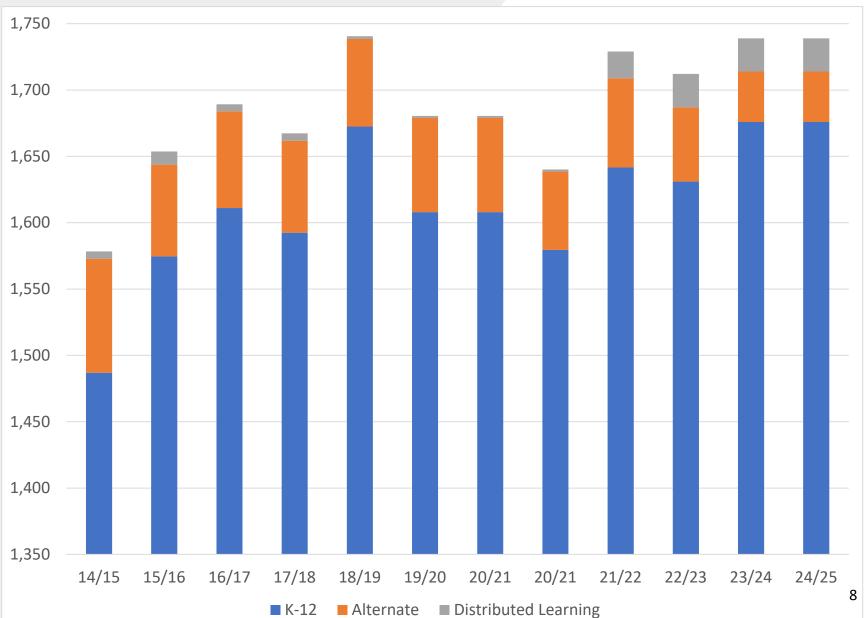

Per student funding rates have increased by an average of 3.4% as detailed in the table below:

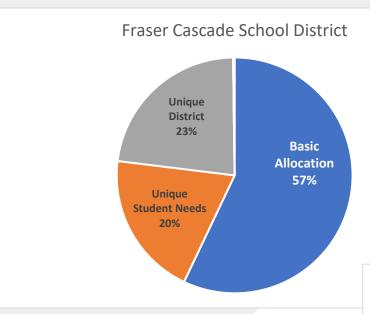

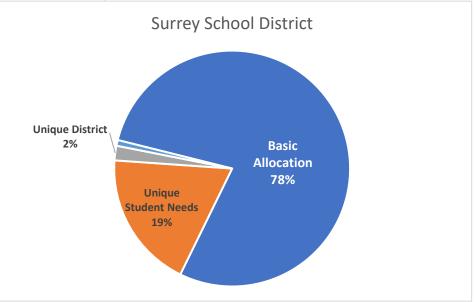


2024/25 OPERATING GRANT INCREASES

INDIGENOUS EDUCATION COUNCIL SUPPORT FUNDING

New to the operating grants for 2024/25 is funding to support the implementation of Indigenous Education Councils (IECs).

The funding envelope as provided by Treasury Board has been allocated to each district based on:

- A \$50,000 base grant per district
- \$9,250 per First Nation located (estimated) within the district's boundaries
- A Rural Factor adjustment (see Table 6c for the Rural Index)

The principles of the funding allocation are:

- Each district will require a base level of funding;
- The complexity of the operations of an IEC may be affected by the number of First Nations a school district is interacting with; and
- Travel to provincial meetings, if necessary, will be more costly for rural districts.

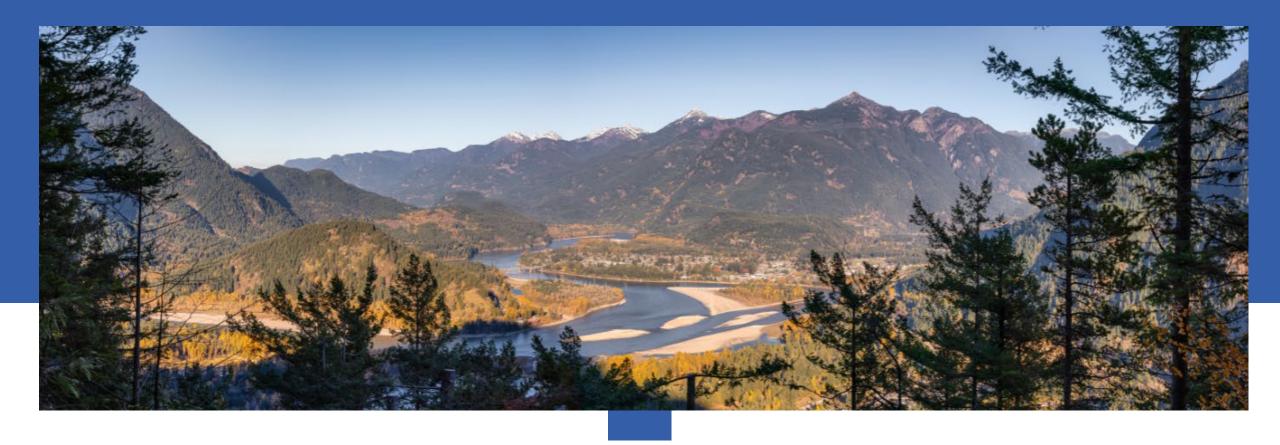
STUDENT & FAMILY AFFORDABILITY FUNDING

In 2022/23 Fraser-Cascade received \$250,000 in Student & Family Affordability Funding (SFAF)

At the end of June 2023, \$134,880 was still unspent and carried over into 2023/24

In the current 2023-24 school year, Ministry is adding \$20 million to SFAF.

- Our share of the SFAF additional funding is \$100,000.
- Carry over into 2024/25 is anticipated
- This is "one-time funding".
